





#### **CONNECTING THE DOTS**



#### **VANAKKAM**



Through collective efforts. Zooxanthellae continues its vital mission, contributing significantly to the sustainability of coral reefs and the broader marine environment.





#### **GREEN GROVE**

Green Grove is a collaborative initiative focused on mangrove restoration which successfully concluded on March 17th. Spearheaded in partnership with IS Avenue through their Cognizant project, this endeavor aims to raise awareness and take concrete steps toward rejuvenating mangrove ecosystems. Recent activities include an impactful awareness session at Hennathota School in Hikkaduwa, enlightening students and the community about the importance of mangrove conservation.



Furthering its commitment, Green Grove has actively engaged in mangrove planting efforts in the Hikkaduwa area, contributing to the rehabilitation and preservation of these invaluable habitats. Supported by technical expertise from the Marine Environment Protection Authority (MEPA) - Galle District Office, the initiative has successfully guided and facilitated restoration activities. Through collaborative endeavors and community participation, Green Grove is leaving a lasting impact by restoring and safeguarding mangrove habitats, bolstering the resilience and sustainability of coastal ecosystems.

#### **BLUE REVIVE**

Blue Revive is an initiative that addresses the urgent issue of marine trash. With millions of tonnes of debris entering oceans yearly, our project focuses on coastal cleanups to combat pollution and promote environmental stewardship.



Split into two waves, First and Second, our efforts began at Panadura Beach, where over 40 volunteers diligently cleared trash. Subsequently, at Mount Lavinia Beach, we engaged 20+ volunteers, raising awareness of marine biodiversity's plight. Despite challenges, including weather and logistics, our team collected over 35 garbage bags, safeguarding marine ecosystems.

As we conclude, Blue Revive remains committed to ongoing cleanups and expanding our impact. We're grateful for community support, and recognizing the importance of collective action in preserving our environment.



#### **CLEAN SL**

Clean SL – a Rotaract District project, is spearheaded by Rotaract Mora, serving as one of the host clubs, with a primary focus on ocean conservation. This multifaceted initiative unfolds across three distinct phases, each contributing to the overarching goal of preserving our marine ecosystems.

Commencing with a beach cleanup September 28th, volunteers worked tirelessly remove marine debris, aiming to pollution's detrimental alleviate effects on coastal areas. Following this, on February 14th, 2024, Clean SL installed ocean strainers at Lunawa, strategically positioned to prevent plastic and debris from entering the ocean, thereby safeguarding marine habitats. This proactive approach serves as a tangible solution to intercept pollutants and preserve marine ecosystems.







The project concluded on March 16th with an impactful underwater cleanup operation and a public awareness session. Volunteers dove beneath the waves to remove submerged debris while concurrently engaging the community to raise awareness about the importance of ocean conservation. Through this holistic approach, Clean SL endeavors to instill a sense of environmental stewardship and inspire collective action to protect our oceans for generations to come.



### FIELD TO BOARDROOM






