Hand In Hand

Hand in Hand is a renowned exertion of Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa organized under the avenue of Community Service. The project has a solid history of nearly a decade, in line with the Rotary Area of Focus, 'Disease prevention and treatment'. Hand in Hand was initiated to be of assistance for the children residing at Apeksha Hospital, Maharagama fighting for their lives to rejoice in their world with big dreams.

Making the scope of the initial idea wider, Rotaract Mora extended its hands to child cancer patients at the teaching Hospital, Karapitiya back in 2018, and in 2022, further expanded its scope by giving a hand to adult cancer patients as well. We were able to donate medicines worth over 1.3 million at the end of this year.







Vesak Card Phase

Obeying the Covid - 19 health and safety measures, we were also able to hold the Vesak Card Campaign from 07th to 11th April 2022 at the BMICH Colombo Shopping Festival. Funds were raised by selling cards and stickers which were yet again decorated with the beautiful artworks drawn by the children residing at Apeksha Hospital, Maharagama, and donations were collected successfully within 04 days with the participation of 42 volunteers of Rotaract Mora as well as a couple of members from the district steering committee as well as other Rotaract Clubs amidst the civil unrest that occurred in the country during the month of April

T-shirt Campaign

As a means of raising more funds, in March 2022, the T-Shirt Campaign was arranged to target the batches of 2020 and 2021 of our university, whose contributions were valued. In comparison to the previous year's T-Shirt Campaign, this year we were able to sell more than 600 t-shirts, each for Rs. 1500.





Connecting the Dots

Connecting the Dots is a massive initiation of Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa. project conducted under Community Service Avenue focused on cultivating peace, unity, and coexistence among various communities and building long-lasting friendships among the Sri Lankan brethren of different creeds that we pressingly need today. In line with four SDG goals and three of Rotary's main focus areas, the project revolved around two main subprojects. These projects, namely Vanakkam and Shalom, addressed the different nationalities and cultures of Sri Lanka





Shalom

'Shalom' is the first sub-project organized under 'Connecting the Dots' which was conceptualized from the month of January. The aim of the project revolves around lending a hand to Catholic students and their families in the city of Negombo with the help of our partnering organization, Big Hearts Community.

The final step of the project aimed toward laying the foundation for future educational endeavors with the students involved. On the 1st of April 2022, an informative and friendly introductory session was carried out for the students who are to be seated for the G.C.E Ordinary Level (O/L) examinations at the St. Sebastian's Church convent during the year's end. Approximately 20 O/L students participated in the session.



Vanakkam

The second initiative of Connecting the Dots, "Vanakkam" focused on the community in laffna. Since education has been identified as a driving force for sustainably promoting peace and reconciliation, project Vanakkam is structured to create opportunities for better education for the students in Jaffna. So the project plan is to find an underdeveloped school in Jaffna, identify the needs of the school, and provide sustainable solutions.



Dream Cricket

Dream Cricket is a community service project conducted by the Rotary Club of Colombo West together with Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa, Rotaract Club of Alumni of University of Moratuwa, Rotaract Club of Colombo West, Rotaract Club of National School of Business Management and Rotaract Club of American National College in partnership with Sir Donald Bradman Foundation, Australia. The event focuses on giving the opportunity for disabled children to engage in activities related to cricket suited to their capabilities while enjoying the day.

This year, the 10th Dream Cricket Day was held on Saturday the 18th of June 2022 at "Turf Colombo", futsal court with the participation of 30 disabled children.

Specially designed activities related to cricket that is suited to the abilities of disabled children were conducted. Breakfast, lunch, and refreshments were provided to all the children and their parents throughout the event, as well as to all the participants. At the end of the day, an award ceremony was held and all the children were appreciated with medals.







Nena Aruna



The noble signature Community Services project 'Nena Aruna' is organized with the goal of improving the educational standards of underprivileged school children while giving them an equal opportunity to participate in their studies during the new normal. The project's first phase was primarily focused on students doing A /Levels in the academic year 2021.

The Nena Aruna Seminar Series is the project's first component, where the series had to be conducted entirely through the Zoom Video Communications platform, due to the presence of the ongoing COVID-19 Pandemic situation. The first virtual seminar in the series was held on September 13, 2021. Students from all around the island were invited to join the virtual lectures presented by the dedicated Rotaractors by joining the WhatsApp groups that were set up. Making the plans a reality, the Nena Aruna community of students grew day by day, emphasizing the quality of classes delivered by our members. Following that, 51 seminars for the main A/Level topics, namely Combined Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Accounting, Economics, and ICT, were held in September and October.

The value of these virtual seminars is that each session had an average attendance of more than 50 students, with the majority exceeding 70 participants. The Nena Aruna team always ensured that the aforementioned seminars would be conducted in an interactive manner in which students felt comfortable enough to unmute themselves and direct questions even at the end of the sessions to explain their uncertainties.

Overall, these seminars attracted participants from all four corners of the country, and it is worth noting that the seminars met their intended purpose in terms of audience reachability for the project. At the same time, the Rotaractors always uploaded the recorded session to the Nena Aruna YouTube channel and helped it reach 1000 subscribers, which is currently still growing. In addition to the foregoing, the 'LearnYou' platform was used to help students explain questions they had about the subject matter.






Suwaliya

Project 'Suwaliya' was brought forward by Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa together with Rotaract Club of the Faculty of Medicine, University of Colombo to focus on the needs of this vulnerable population and empower and provide the necessary support for girls living in orphanages. After a community assessment among the target audience of Rotaractors and Interactors regarding sexual and reproductive health, a series of webinars were conducted by some of the experts in the field: Dr. Prabodhana Ranaweera, Consultant Obstetrician and Gynecologist about adolescent reproductive health, and Dr. Nilanka Wickramasinghe, Senior Lecturer of the Department of Physiology, Faculty of Medicine, University of Colombo - about adolescent nutrition and physical health. Based on the information collected via the survey and webinars, a booklet was publicized including the topics such as puberty, sexuality, contraception, LGBTQ+ awareness, and adolescent nutrition. Afterward, a donation campaign was conducted, commemorating Women's Day, to provide orphaned adolescent girls with the basic necessities to maintain proper hygiene and improve their quality of life. A donation of 'dignity kits' which contain items such as sanitary napkins, soap, toothpaste, etc. was provided along with the pre-recorded webinars regarding sexual and reproductive health. For this phase, Suwaliya partnered with Aarya+ to obtain the sanitary napkins needed for the dignity packs. In total, over 1400 sanitary 55 napkins were donated to the Lankaadhara Society' and the 'Ceylon Moor Ladies' Society'.

The final phase of project Suwaliya was the development of a mobile application called 'Suwa Kekulu'. The main aim of this was to empower mothers to improve knowledge of health, be aware of the importance of maintaining the CHDR, and better take care of themselves and their children. This app was useful to monitor development, growth, nutrition, and immunization, and it provides necessary knowledge concerning various aspects of the health and well-being of a child under the age of 5 years. This is a user-friendly and reliable application validated by the Family Health Bureau owing to the efforts of Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa. The launching of the "Suwa Kekulu" app was held on the 31st of May 2022, together with a health guide for teenage girls, an illustrated short story "You Can Fly" and the most integral component of the initiative, the donation of the dignity packs to Amana Banks Orphan Care.



ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICE

Zooxanthellae

'Understanding the importance of conserving the marine ecosystem entangled with the coral colonies, the project Zooxanthellae 21-22 was initiated with the aim of regrowing the coral colonies and raising awareness among the general public on the importance of the coral reefs and marine ecosystem. Preceding a triumphant deployment of the 1st phase at Mirissa beach, Matara, the 2nd phase of the project Zooxanthellae 2021-22 started off with the immense knowledge and experience gained from the previous phase. The shallow sea bed near Kamburugamuwa, Matara was selected to be the deposition location and has been currently ongoing from 20th May 2022 onwards with the aim of depositing specially designed 20 concrete structures transplanting the baby corals on them.

Having gained national as well as international recognition, Zooxanthellae has been giving voice to the importance of protecting the corals and the marine ecosystem in Sri Lanka.

With the active participation of Rotarians, Rotaractors, Interactors, and the natives near the coastal line, their efforts will undoubtedly help the strong existence of the project, which in turn will bring them the benefits of making their coastlines yet another tourist attraction centerpiece.







Woof Roof

'Woof Roof' was initiated to rescue the lives of innocent street dogs from abuse and abandonment by providing them with a caring roof, and by bridging the gap between interested parties and street dogs while also raising public awareness about animal care. This opens doors for gentlehearted volunteers to give their hands to those innocent paws by finding them a loving home at each stage of the project." Woofy's Competition" was a photography and art competition about street dogs held as a subproject of "Woof Roof" to generate more social awareness about the innocent lives of street dogs. The next step: the Adoption Program was allocated for rescuing street dogs, conducting medical checkups, and giving them away for adoption. It was planned to carry out a PR campaign to spread the word about the initiative and encourage people to bring the street dogs in their vicinity to the location. Dog lovers who were looking to adopt a street pooch were also to be invited, where we ultimately find loving homes for these dogs. Before giving them away for adoption, the plan was to conduct a medical check-up for those street dogs and a basic vaccine program free of charge. However, due to the pandemic, the Adoption Program could not be seen to its conclusion.

CONCLUSION

Shifting gears, team Woof Roof strategically changed courses to focus on a different endeavor that involved feeding the strays and medicating them for their skin infections. As a collaboration with the International Services joint project 'Dusty Paws', on the 26th of January 2022, members from both Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa and Rotaract Club of Yala, Nepal stepped out to the streets to feed the hungry stray dogs and treat them with the Amoxicillin tablet.

Team Woof Roof was unable to have Woof Roof days once again due to the pandemic. As the famous saying goes, "every cloud has a silver lining". The silver lining of the challenging circumstances was that it broadened the target audience and brought international recognition to Woof Roof. Moreover, the responsibility of continuing the project by conducting Adoption days and follow-up programs will be handed over to the Rotaract year 2022-23.



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Grove Green

Grove Green was initiated with the intention of restoring the Mangrove ecosystem in Sri Lanka. The project is centered on the one-ofa-kind building of a mutually beneficial link mangrove forests and between the surrounding communities. With the ultimate purpose of preserving the environment, the solve aims to social program environmental issues when regenerating the mangrove ecology in a certain location. Grove Green was carried out with the guidance Marine technical of the Environmental Protection Authority(MEPA) -Galle District Office. The project focused on achieving SDGs, Climate Action, Life Below Water, Life on Land, and Partnership for the Goals. Furthermore, it covered Rotary Focus Area, Supporting the Environment.







The culmination of the project, mangrove restoration was executed in Hikkaduwa on the 29th of April, 2022. Grove Green was able to take a major stride in the Hikkaduwa wastewater treatment plant. The treated wastewater was being discharged to the nearby water resources, and this discharged water is highly eutrophicated with high concentrations of Nitrogen and Phosphorus, which is hazardous for the sheltered habitats for fish, corals, and algae. The restoration was done on the treatment plant side bank with more than 250 'Brugueira Gymnorhiza' mangrove plants. The project was carried out along with an awareness session as well. A monitoring session will follow this phase in another six months to monitor the progress.

Urbanscape

Urbanscape is an initiative that was brought to life by Environmental Service Avenue for the first time with the intention of promoting urban edible gardening while taking necessary provisions to establish urban gardening structures in urban areas.

Growroom

As the initiation of the second phase, the 'Growroom' concept is brought forth and this is the first time in Sri Lanka to build and promote Growrooms to spread awareness of urban gardening. Standing tall as a spherical garden, Grow Room empowers people to grow their own food locally in a beautiful and sustainable way. The initial structure for the implementation was designed this year and surveys were conducted to collect details on the location we intend to establish.





The initial idea was to choose University premises as the location. Urbanscape paves the way to less spaced urban communities where they are encouraged contribute to the environment. Furthermore, it can be identified as an attempt in reducing the high percentage of carbon dioxide footprint in urban areas. Taking this project forward more effectively will definitely provide relief to this problem. Initially starting from the University level, the project Urbanscape will level up its standards gradually in public places and broaden the public's focus and awareness of the project. With Urbanscape, we focus on achieving SDGs, "Affordable and Clean Energy", "Sustainable Cities and Communities" and "Partnership for the Goals". Moreover, it focuses on achieving Rotary Focus Area, "Economic and Community Development".

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

31st Rotaract District Conference

Among the extravagant projects carried out by RID 3220, the Rotaract District Conference takes a significant place, which rolls down its supportive strategies to create a platform for discussion of contemporary trends in youth development, a celebration of service, and a space for engagement and learning for our fellow Rotaractors in the spirit of volunteerism. After a hiatus of 2 years due to the pandemic, the conference returned to its physical context in its 31st edition.



Rotaract Club of University of Moratuwa got the opportunity in becoming a host club this year as well following the years of strong collaboration, and joined hands with four other host clubs: Rotaract Clubs of Colombo Fort, Kadawatha, Kandy, and Faculty of Engineering - University of Jaffna joined together with the District Steering Committee, in making the conference the best, if not one of the best in its history. Carrying the theme of "A Progressive Youth; Co-creating Sri Lanka", the 31st Rotaract District Conference was held In the beautiful city of Negombo, alongside the fascinating and picturesque beach, on 2nd April 2022, providing a platform to engage in very timely and fruitful discussions and activities.







The conference was filled with fruitful discussions, speeches, and messages on timely topics delivered by great personalities like District Rotaract Representative Rtn. Rtr. PP Akhila Adishwara, District Rotaract Representative-Elect Rtn. Rtr. PP Ahamed Hussain, District Rotaract Representative Nominee Rtr. PP. Sathma Jayasinghe from the Rotaract District Steering Committee as well as Rotary District Governor 2021-22, Rtn. PHF PP Aruni Malalasekara, District Rotaract Chair, Rtn. PHF PP Marshad Barry representing the Rotary. The ice-breaker session conducted by Ms. Pramukshi Kariyawasam, Director of Brand Strategy and Marketing at Cinnamon Hotels and Resorts, and the entertainment item performed by Ms. Shavinki Fernando certainly added more color to the event.

A much-needed and interesting panel discussion was also held featuring Dr. Beshan Kulapala, Director and co-founder of Vega Innovations; Dr. Tilak Siyambalapitiya, an Energy consultant and a visiting lecturer at several universities, and Ms. Amanthi Perera, Head of Social Sustainability at MAS, which was moderated by Mr. Sachinda Dulanjana who is an experienced facilitator, leadership trainer and motivational speaker.

An interactive group activity was held where the attendees could come up with solutions to the rising problems of the country with the guidance of mentors from the District Steering Committee. This year's conference introduced a unique element to the event, where the best of Rotaract was paraded under the "Rotaract Showcase". 16 clubs of the Rotaract District 3220 along with the 5 host clubs got the opportunity in exhibiting their projects to the attendees and distinguished guests under the four main avenues of the Rotaract movement: Community Services, Club Service, International Service, and Professional Development.

Data Storm

'Data Storm' was launched in the year 2020 with the goal of allowing young analytical minds to demonstrate their skills in the field of data analytics, as well as allowing industry experts to observe and assess the participants' potential. The unique feature of 'Data Storm,' and the reason it differs from traditional datathons, is that it demands participants to understand ways to deliver novel and feasible solutions to the given scenario, rather than only detecting patterns and links between the data presented.

Under the Professional Development avenue, 'Data Storm' was organized for the third year in a row, with the driving force behind 'Data Storm 3.0' being John Keells Group, a powerhouse in the field of data analytics.







a.Introductory Webinar Series

The project began with an introductory webinar series that explained the fascinating ins and outs of data science to people with an interest in the area. Mr.Chalitha Perera, Former Data Scientist, Lead R & D Engineer at ArithmixAI, presented the first webinar in the series on the topic of 'What is Data Science and Career Opportunities' on the 7th of February, 2022. Participants were able to learn about AI, Deep Learning, and Machine Intelligence in general, as well as an introduction to Data Science and career prospects, throughout the session. question-and-answer session followed the presentation to address audience concerns. On the 8th and 9th of March, two further webinars in line with the same webinar series were held. Dr. Amal Shehan Perera, Senior Lecturer at the University of Moratuwa, led the second introductory webinar on 'Data Cleaning, Pre-Processing, and Machine Learning Practices. Dr. Indika Gamage, resource person in Data Science, Computer Vision, Machine Learning, and Artificial Intelligence, led a session on 'Algorithm Selection and Machine Learning Practices' as the third and final introductory webinar.

Following this, registrations for Data Storm commenced. By the 23rd of March, the datathon secured more than 100 teams from state universities and private universities, giving it a promising start on its voyage.



b. Masterclass 1.0

While the registration procedure was in progress, a 'Masterclass 1.0' was conducted exclusively for the enrolled teams. The purpose of this workshop was to offer participants a basic foundation in Data Science and to help them perform better in the data analytics case. Important topics including what is Machine Learning, model selection, and metrics, as well as converting insights into action, were discussed.

On the 25th of March, the 'Storming Round' began. On the Kaggle platform, Following the Storming Round, the review process received 20 reports from registered teams. Due to the power interruptions and the current scenario, we have to extend the time for the contestants. The viewing procedure was examined by Dr. Upeksha Ganegoda, Dr. Ranga Rodrigo, and Dr. Chamira U.S. Edussooriya.





c.Masterclass 2.0

'Masterclass 2.0' was a session designed especially for the semi-finalists to help them prepare for the semi-finals by providing them with information on topics such as Sales Forecasting and Regression, Modeling Methodology for Forecasting Sales, Over Forecasting, Under Forecasting, and Buffer Calculation.

Mr. Kiruparan Balachandran (Senior Data Scientist, OCTAVE - John Keells Group) and Mr.Anuk Dissanayake (Data Science and Engineering Associate, OCTAVE - John Keells Group) guided the semi-finalists by giving them a good grip on every detail that is important for the final round as resource persons for the session

Data Storm received a Semi-finals Round earlier this year. The semi-final round was designed to increase the competitiveness of the competition. We were able to reduce the reduction in entries for this year's competition by giving the contestants greater prior experience in solving the case.

15 teams proceeded to the Semi-final Case Track of Data Storm 3.0 from the Storming Round. OCTAVE - The John Keells Group created an industry-level case study with a real-world problem for participants to solve. Binary Trio, Data Dreamers, Team Pan, Decision Makers, and Team Ares were chosen from a shortlist of five teams for the Grand Finale.



d.Grand Finale

The **Grand Finale** was held on April 9th, 2022 at 9 a.m. on the premises of DHPL, Nawam Mawatha, Colombo 7. The comprehensive case study and data set were released at 9.15 a.m., giving four hours to work on the case and to submit the presentation slides. The Pitching Round, which determined who would win the Grand Finale of Data Storm 3.0, started at 1.30 p.m. on the same day. Two teams competed virtually, while the remaining teams competed in a Pitching Round at the venue.

The evaluation panel for this round Vindhya consisted of Mahavithana (Analytics Delivery Manager at OCTAVE -Holdings), Iohn Keells Kiruparan Balachandran (Senior Data Scientist at OCTAVE - John Keells Holdings), Sarmilan Sivanesasuntharam (Senior Data Scientist at OCTAVE - John Keells Holdings), Vithushan Vijayananthan (Data Science and Engineering Associate at OCTAVE - John Keells Holdings), Dr. Ranga Rodrigo (Senior Lecturer at the Department of Computer Science, University of Moratuwa) and Dr. Amal Shehan Perera (Senior Lecturer at the



Department of Computer Science Engineering, University of Moratuwa). University of Moratuwa). Under a different set of marking criteria, the outcomes of the Grand Finale allocated a 50% weightage for the Semi-finals report submission and the other 50% for the Pitching round.

Following a month-long journey, the Data Dreamers have been crowned as the victors of Data Storm 3.0. After a tough battle, Team Pan and Binary Trio came in second and third, respectively. The tournament was a big success, demonstrating to the rest of the globe that Data Science-driven innovation and technology can be game-changing.




b.Ludo House Cup




Indiretto


Rotaract Mora Jam Room'21

The tour officially began on April 10th, 2022, as anticipated. The first phase focused on investigating the island's heartland, the central and Sabaragamuwa provinces. The guests were truly amused by iconic destinations such as the Dambatenne Tea Factory and spectacular waterfalls such as St. Claire's and Devon Falls. The guests were also granted the unique opportunity to experience and actively participate in avrudu celebrations on the 14th of April. A tour of Negombo followed.











Phase 2 included a visit to Munneswaram Hindu temple, one of the most revered Hindu temple complexes dedicated to Lord Shiva which was followed by a trip to the Puttalam Beach Park and a safari hosted by the Wilpattu National Park. The highlight of the day was seeing a rare leopard of Sri Lanka, which brought the hands-on wildlife safari experience for many first-timers to a close. 


Boon Digiti

"Boon Digiti" is a novel project aimed to elevate basic understanding the Information **Technology** (IT) among teachers undergraduates of and in Tanzania. Even though ICT Training is mandatory according to the Tanzanian Education policy, due to the lack of resources, this is not implemented, giving rise to certain inequalities in the education system. To help mitigate this issue, the project joined hands with Rotaract Club of Mwenge Catholic University, RID 9214. The first phase focused on imparting IT knowledge to the members of Rotaract Club of Mwenge University, assisting around 3000 students and 50 teachers in Tanzania.

The organized syllabus for the project was carried out in 4 stages, where each concentrated on an introduction to computing and MS word, MS Excel, MS PowerPoint, MS Publisher, and Windows Installation. Visual videos and PDFs on the subjects were released, making it accessible to anyone on the internet. By the end of phase one, Boon Digiti was successful in creating a video library of 31 informative videos within 4 months, along with continuous quizzes and assignments.

The mission of the project is to join forces with ten more Rotaract clubs around the world. Boon Digiti hopes to launch a website and design more courses and publish them as the second phase of the project. This phase will further allow us to share our knowledge with African and South Asian regions.
